

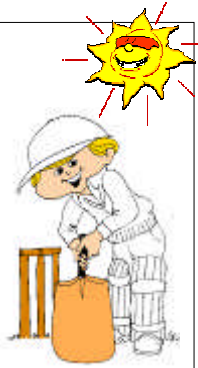


## NDSC Survey

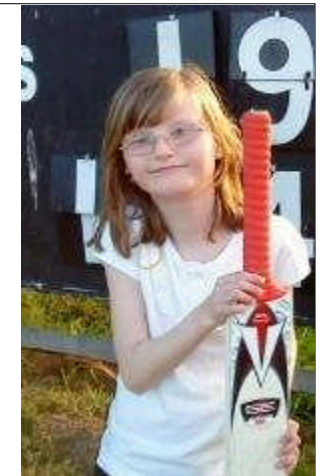

## More Cricket

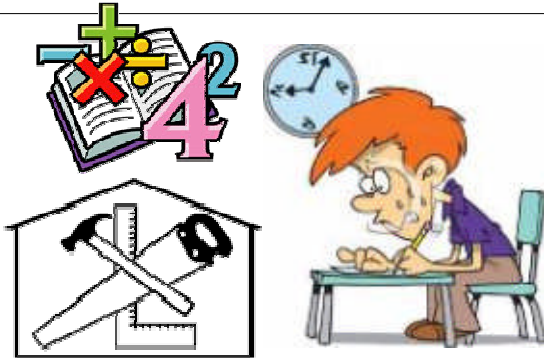
