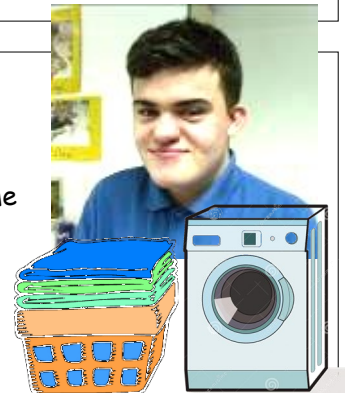
Edward FM
